## January 29th: Alice Across America: The Story of the First All-Girl American Road Trip by Sarah Glenn Marsh

Writer Sarah Glenn Marsh and illustrator Gilbert Ford's Alice Across America is a nonfiction picture book account of maverick Alice Ramsey, the first woman to drive a car across America in 1909. With a clever blend of women's history, technological history, and American roading geography, this is a celebration of unstoppable women making strides in twentieth-century America.

- H.L. Wheeler has bought H.P. Gerald's new cottage on Main street.
- Miss Mary J. Brewster will sail for Europe the 19th of this month to be gone a year.
- The Brookfield Brass Band will hold a social dance in town hall, Saturday evening, Jan. 19.
- Don't fail to see Howard Brummett's picture in water colors of "Among the Breaker," on exhibition in L.G. Thompson's store window.
- Warren Bacon sold 105,000 paper boxes last month, disposing of his surplus. He is now making
  as many boxes as his accommodations will allow.
- C.S. Corbin and E.C. Strong, agents of the American Cereal Co., of New York, stopped at the Brookfield house recently.
- The hedge is being removed and the trees cut down in front of the Clapp place on Pleasant street. The house is to be raised, repaired, and 12 rooms added. When done it will be used for a hotel.
