HISTORY: A LOOK BACK The *Brookfield Times* | September 1894

- Geo. W. Oakes has nearly 500 asters in bloom.
- H.C. Mason is doing the brick work for H. P. Gerald's cottage on the lot near the Spoouer estate on Main street. Levi Sherman will do the carpenter work.
- Frost in low lands here on Wednesday morning.
- Mr. Leno, dealer in fish, oysters, etc., is out this week with his new cart neatly painted and fitted up, the work of A.J. Mellen.
- Fred Barrett and a number of other people from here attended the Sturbridge cattle show this week.
- An alarm of fire here Monday called out the engine. A spark of fire from the chimney in the church block, Main street, set the roof on fire, but it was extinguished by the wind before doing any damage.
- Quite a little business is being done in the old Brewster & Twichell shop near the railroad, where Cole & Gerald are manufacturing the Greyhound bicycle; eight or nine men are being employed, making all the parts and putting them together. A number have already been sold.
- The Water Commissioners request all persons now using the water in the reservoir, to boil it, before using for cooking or drinking purposes.
- The young ladies talk of forming a whist club here for the coming winter.
- The Cranberry crop is almost a failure here, owing to the dry season.
