

• The ice is said to be 27 inches thick on Quaboag pond; never before known to be as thick.

- A lady lost a fur tippet between here and Spencer the night of the District Grange. Finder will confer a favor by returning it to Mrs. S.A. Fitts.
- There have been 29,644 books taken from the Library during the year 1894, making an average of 97 books daily. The largest day's work was 297 and the smallest 16, the library being open only in the eve of that day.
- C.A. Rice has moved into the new elevator house near the depot. It is connected by telephone with Martin Donahue's store, Crosby block, Central street, where orders may be left and will receive prompt attention.
- Boys have begun playing marbles on our streets, a sure sign of spring.
