- Mrs. Wm. Eaton's hydrangea has had 190 blossoms on it this season.
- Don't forget the concert Sunday night in the town hall, at 6 o'clock.
- Levi Davis has filled an order for two pounds of tea and sent to Mrs. Fred A. Rice of Basin, Montana, as they cannot buy as good tea in that locality as we have here on sale.
- Beware of agents selling stove blacking in a wooden box covered with red paper; ladies purchased two boxes for 25 cents which had blacking in top and the rest being sand.
- The reading room on Prouty St., is soon to be open evenings as it was last winter.
- Mrs. L.S. Pierce is improving her house by building a covered piazza in front 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet wide.
- The state board of health have analyzed the river water and declared it unhealthy and dangerous for drinking purposes.
- The work at the paper box shop is rushing, making about 4,000 boxes daily.
- H.P. Gerald has purchased the Gerald block on Central St., of his father, and intends to repair it or build new in the spring.
- There is an umbrella at the town hall that has been awaiting an owner since the children's temperance concert.
- The new firm of Tyler & Moulton, who occupy the west portion of Geo. W. Burt & Co.'s shop, are cutting fifty dozen fine shoes daily and made their first shipment on Thursday. We are glad to see the young men go into business and wish them success in many ways.
