- The Brookfield Band has reorganized with G.H. Riley, leader and director and H.W. Irwin, business manager. They have played one engagement and are ready to receive others. They are to have a social dance in the town hall April 19th The proceeds are to be used to pay a debt of the band and also to defray the expenses of open air concerts each week during the season. It is hoped that all who are interested in the concerts will either buy a ticket or contribute a small sum, as an opportunity will be afforded by members of the band. The success of these concerts depends largely upon the public.
