# HISTORY: A LOOK BACK The *Brookfield Times* | February 1894

- The snow the first of the week reminded the people of the storm March 11, 1888.
- Landlord Dean is heating the Brookfield House as it never was before, with the new steam heating apparatus.
- Charles E. Clark has bought land on the corner of Lincoln and Pleasant streets and will erect a two story block for a bakery and store, where he will keep a variety store, where will be kept such articles as are usually found in a country store.
- L. E. Thresher has cut about 600 tons of ice and stored it for summer use.
- Napoleon Guertin of Ayer has opened the "Eatwell Cafe," in Mulcahy & Capen's block, River street, where he will furnish board and lodgings for \$3.75 per week, and a single meal 25 cents.
- The Commander-in-chief of the Grand Army was instructed by the 27th national encampment, to request Grand Army posts to hold proper services on Washington's birthday. In obedience to the above, posts are requested to hold such services.
